

n July of 2013, the JRLA Board of Directors invited **Promise Schools**, La non-profit management company, to lead the school. Together, the JRLA Board and Promise Schools have designed an academic program based on the "Big 3" key predictors of college success: 1) mastery of academic skills and content knowledge; 2) the development of academic habits and soft skills like perseverance and self-advocacy; and 3) the cultivation of identity, relevance, and belonging. By targeting each of these areas, JRLA graduates are much more ready to succeed when they step onto a college campus. For example, some of our suburban counterparts receive \$12,000 per student while we only receive \$8,000 in state aid. In addition, unlike traditional public schools, charter schools do not receive funding to purchase, lease, or improve their facilities. This causes financial challenges that can limit our ability

to reach our ambitious educational goals and provide appropriate accommodations. To fully prepare our students to go off to college and graduate, we need to raise significant funds from private sources (individuals, corporations and foundations) to bridge our gap. 
